A 1970s Fluxus classic is reimagined for today in this performance by Woods (“a cellist of power and grace” –*The Guardian*) and Topel, a composer, sound artist and Dartmouth music professor. Donning a wetsuit, Woods plays a cello made of dyed-black ice, outfitted by Topel with transmitters, whose signals Topel processes in real time. Woods rubs, scrapes and even hacks away at his melting instrument—drawing from it sound he likens to previously “frozen” voices of the Black Lives Matter movement.

### **- Dinner and Discussion with Édouard Louis and Didier Eribon, April 26**

Discussion and dinner with  
Montgomery Fellows  
**Édouard Louis**  
and  
**Didier Eribon**

Born in 1992 as Eddy Bellegueule in the small village of Hallencourt in northern France, Édouard changed his surname to Louis when he left the violent working-class milieu of his parents and moved to Paris. He quickly became the most celebrated French writer of his generation when he—just twenty-two years old—published his first novel *En finir avec Eddy Bellegueule* (Éditions du Seuil) in 2014.

A professor of philosophy in the sociology dept. at the Université de Picardie Jules Verne in Amiens, Didier Eribon has widely recognized as a public intellectual. His autobiographical “nonfiction novel” *Returning to Reims* has become a bestseller since it first appeared in 2009. Upon attending his father’s funeral, Eribon describes his estrangement from the working-class world he had left behind thirty years earlier to study philosophy in Paris and to become a journalist writing about about philosophy, literature and the history of gay life.
